Diptford Short Mat Bowls Club May 2024

It has been a particularly difficult period from 2020 when Covid came on the scene to 2024. The 'end' of Covid has left some people with the problem of 'long covid' to contend with, and many are still concerned with the possibility of

catching some form of mutation of the dreaded disease. Not only are there physical concerns but also issues over mental/social worries. However, those members who have managed to keep going and participate have benefitted from taking part. Bowls England have issued all sorts of advice and regulations in order to play through the epidemic. These regulations whilst allowing playing to continue have also added to the overall worries. However, we have come through having been tested in the extreme and not just for our bowling ability. Members have taken part in the Devon County competitions at the Manor Hotel Okehampton. Devon County Short Mat Bowls Association moved from ISCA Exeter to the new venue at the end of 2023. The Manor have been very accommodating, and there have been excellent games played at the new venue.

The South Hams Short Mat Bowls Association managed to keep the three major competitions going despite a reduced membership. Diptford took part in the Knock Out, Tens and the League. The officials for Devon and South Hams are to be thanked for keeping the Bowling Going through these difficult times.

Diptford were in the Division two of the South Hams League. In the end, after all the postponed fixtures were eventually played, Diptford came fourth out of seven sides. Having played 12 matches with shots for of 318 and shots against of 311, difference being 7; wins 5, draws 3.and lost 4, points 41 with an average of 3.4. We had the same points for and average as South Milton Sanders, but they had two more winning matches.

We now have ten 'full' members with seven 'part-time' members. Five are coming from Torquay just for the summer, as their short mat bowls close for the summer.

May Edition 2024 [April Nature Notes 2024]



Winter has slowly released its grip, and more Spring-like weather has shown what spring should be like! The sky blue and grey-white has given squally showers and cooling winds. However, the intense sunlight promises good weather to come, that is if the signs can be read correctly. Trees have really come into green leaf and plants are growing rapidly. Each species breaking out in its allotted space, some very early and all rushing through its expected growth, flowering and seeding in very quick time. Blink and you have missed the moment. How quickly has each colourful period been? Snowdrop, Daffodil, Celandine, Primrose, Sloe, Bluebells have all come and gone together with the lesser performers from the gardens. Every thing seems to be in such a hurry to 'catch up'.

Notice how these 'true' blue bells above, have the flowers all along the bottom side of the stalk. The larger 'Spanish Bells' have the flowers looking like Hyacinth, but not so full. These Spanish bells are very prolific and crossing with the traditional Blue bells to outgrow them Their strap-like fleshy leaves, and very irregular large bulbs are difficult to remove from the ground as they seem to form a vertical 'chain' of bulbs that break off and regrow with ease.

Dandelions, Muscari, Anemone Blanda, Forget-me-not, and Hellebores have all flowered well considering the damp conditions.

Cleared out the mini-pond in the first week of April. Had to take out so much weed as the pond was being choked with vegetation. A toad, several two-inch froglets, and numerous Newts together with two large dark fish, many smaller ones and lots of small tadpoles in the mix, were all pleased to be given far more room in which to move. Had forgotten just how deep and wide the pond actually was. The removed weed was left on the side by the pond so that any small friends could scramble-back into the water. It was completed on a dry sunny day and the disturbed flies and gnats stacked up above the water surface, rising and falling in the sunlight, like floating jewels.

The lawn is bedecked with a riot of weed flowers. They do look very pretty, but not a grass lawn! From where do bulbs of the club-like Lesser Celandines come? They are such a splendid bright golden colour it is a shame to remove them from the grassy pattern display. Purple Violets add fragrance to the display. Honesty flowers have grown up on tall stems so quickly. Their flowers shining brightly in the shadows. The Camelia flowers have come and gone, singles, doubles, dark red pink and white. Falling to the ground as screwed up 'clumps of brown paper'.

Aubretia clusters have started as green mounds and now filled out as 'red', 'lilac', or 'white' clumps. Straggling wallflowers pouring scent in the sunshine to fill the garden. They look even more unkept as the flowers go over. The spring patterns of colour have been quite magnificent despite the rain and damp soil conditions. Tulip flowers have filled their bowls up with water, forced open and with combination of damp and wind been stripped of their petals to leave the coloured confetti litter spread around. Red new Sycamore leaves just breaking through the 'lime-green' buds with flesh-coloured casings, and chocolate markings.

Birds, having paired up and chosen nesting sites are busy protecting their nests, collecting more material, and busy reproducing. The fields and gardens becoming alive with the noise of the natural orchestra, earlier and earlier, and later following the course of the sun.

Spring is performing its magic and summer is waiting in the wings to give its best show! Enjoy the season! Ham 2024 April

HIGHWAY MAINTENANCE OR LACK OF



Diptford Parish Council is becoming increasingly concerned about the state of our local roads. Cllrs Franklin and Crocker toured some of the worst areas with Nick Colton, our DCC Highways Engineer recently and sent him a long list of identified defects. Whilst Nick was very helpful and, indeed, some of the defects listed have or are being addressed, we are aware that our local network comes fairly low down the list of priorities for DCC! Our MP, Anthony Mangnall, has secured a debate in the House of Commons at the end of April addressing these issues and a number of us have responded, in fairly robust fashion, to the

The importance of reporting reporting reporting! Anyone can report potholes, defective street lighting, drainage and Rights of

Way issues on the Devon County Council website under 'report a problem'. This is by far the best way to notify Highways of the issues we find on a day to day basis.

However, one idea which Nick Colton mentioned on our journey around the parish roads, is the **DCC ROAD WARDEN SCHEME**. The Road Warden Scheme is organised via the parish or town council. Each parish or town council can have a nominated Road Warden and can be supported by local volunteers. Communities are able to carry out minor works which DCC are no longer able to resource and do not have a legal responsibility to carry out.

DCC provide third party insurance for the works.

Free training on DCC arranged courses

Priority status for Highway Maintenance Community Enhancement Fund (HMCE) Fund applications

Participating Schemes are eligible for a certain amount of materials etc to carry out the tasks. The Road Wardens in consultation with the Highways Engineer, would be able to work on potholes which are currently too small to meet the criteria for DCC to fill them but, as we all know, filling a small hole will prevent it from expanding to become a greater problem.

Diptford Parish Council is looking for volunteers to enable us to consider joining the scheme, Cllr Crocker (trevorcoombesheadfarm@outlook.com) has offered to lead on this and if you would be interested in volunteering, please contact him or Ali Kohler our Parish Clerk on diptfordpc@yahoo.co.uk.

This would be in addition to the contract your Council has with our Parish Lengthsman who does such a good job with our buddleholes, drains and ditches.

May 2024

Spring has managed to emerge from the rain and cool temperatures of winter and April, at last. There have been sporadic days of bright warm weather. Is this deluding us into believing that a proper warm May is on its way? The garden is beginning to look more like a spring garden after its long winter rest! Watch out as Nature could still deliver a cold body blow with a later frost, hail or sleet! Have you any sacking to throw over more tender plants to protect them from frost, especially if they have produced fresh young tender shoots!

How about a bit of work to keep the garden in trim?

- Water in dry weather. Yes, those drying east winds can quickly dry out the soil and easily desiccate new tender green shoots. Watch out for brown edge scorch on the leaf margins.
- It goes without saying to keep weeds under control, the hoe is your friend especially on dry days.
- ✤ Have you managed to harden off those tender annuals?
- Prick out and pot on late-sown annuals, keep them under protection!
- Are the supports ready for annual climbers, especially Beans and Peas.
- Once the danger of frosts have past, usually the last week of May, get the tender annuals and perennials can be planted out.
- Spring bulbs can be tidied up as foliage begins to die back. No need to tie them up in knots as the Victorian/Edwardian gardeners used to do, unless you have a few spare apprentice gardeners available! [Not the Grandchildren!]
- ✤ Remove spent foliage and compost.
- You have been covering up the shoots of Dahlias and other tender plants if outside?
- Straw under the strawberries will help protect them from water splash rot. Cardboard pieces or even squares of carpet will do just as well, but using man-made fibre carpets is not a good idea as these artificial materials will not rot down to enhance the environment. Check for slugs and snails periodically under these protective squares.
- Look after the greenhouse. Ventilate on warm days, water early in the day or late evening. Think about shading! Either painted protection or netting.
- Feed once a week, with a compound fertiliser [liquid or granular].
- Continue to sow bedding plants for use later in the year. After they have been hardened off.
- Lawns need a bit of attention. Mow regularly, apply selective weed killer and moss killer later in the month. Apply nitrogenous fertiliser later in the month, but not after new seed.
- ✤ Have you staked those plants in need of support?
- ✤ Dead-head early-flowering plants.
- ✤ Keep trimming loose growth.
- ↔ Watch out for pests and diseases. Treat appropriately.
- Shread clean material and compost.
- ✤ Water newly planted displays.
- Prune plants that have finished flowering
- ✤ Finish planting evergreen trees and shrubs.
- Lightly clip hedges as required, especially plants overhanging paths and steps.
- ✤ Take softwood cuttings [geraniums, fuchsias etc].
