Support for Parish Councillors on action for Climate and Nature



Ruth Leonard-Williams, Project Manager at Sustainable South Hams, in collaboration with Cllr John McKay, Lead Member for Climate Change and Biodiversity at South Hams District Council, and Adam Williams, Principal Climate Change Officer, are offering support and advice for Parish Councillors on climate action. A significant number are keen to help enable more community action around climate and nature. We are planning to develop a support package for councillors to help with this - but want to make sure that it meets

councillors' needs and understand better what forms of support would be useful and the sort of content they would like it to contain.

Dogs need ID too!

Over the last few weeks, our Localities Team have picked up several lost dogs across the South Hams who don't have an ID tag.

Because of this, reuniting a dog to its owner can take far longer, and can be a stressful time for both the furry friend and its family.

We are reminding residents to keep their dogs safe by making sure they wear an ID tag.

Under the Dog Act 1992, the legal requirements are:

- A dog must be licensed and microchipped.
- A dog must wear a collar with a name/ID tag (exemptions apply for some working dogs).
