NORTH HUISH COMMUNITY GROUP



This group was set up in 2023 with the purpose of organising community events for the residents of North Huish and surrounding villages. The venue is St Mary's Church, North Huish, now closed for regular public worship but kept open to the public, providing a meeting space for the local community. This beautiful Grade 1 listed building is in the care of the Churches Conservation Trust, a national charity protecting historic churches at risk. Funds donated at events held there, help to support the cost of repair and maintenance which, in a typical year, can amount to nearly £2,000. Currently, there is a power supply but no electric circuit installed so, this year, a proportion of the funds raised are to be set aside to pay for the installation of electric sockets where they are most needed for safety and convenience when running events.

NEWS ON THE MAINTENANCE OF ST MARY'S DIPTFORD GRAVEYARD

The Diptford Church graveyard has had it's first cut under the management of the South Hams District Council. It is the first time for many years that the complete graveyard has been cut. Much of the cut grass has been removed but a substantial amount still needs to be raked off. The plan of action is for the church and volunteers to keep the paths clear to visited graves. This is solely dependent on volunteers coming forward. The grave mapping is continuing and work is being scheduled to build a large compost bin for the excess grass cuttings to be stored in and for visitors to graves to put spent flowers into. They are also looking at some of the trees to potentially clean out dead wood and provide access to the grave's underneath.

Retirement of Steve 'the Postie'

After lots of secret card signing and donations, the day finally arrived to present Steve the postie with his leaving gift. It was thanks to Marion our post mistress that we got him on time to the post office thinking that he had parcels to collect. Instead a very large turn out from the village were waiting to say there farewells.

Nancy, the prime mover in this as in so many other village initiatives, said how much he had meant to each and everyone and that he was going to be greatly missed. He was presented with the card and donations totalling £1250.

He said he was touched and thanked everyone individually.

Having done the rounds for something like 45 years, he is already missed by so many of us.

Diptford Parish Council Notes on August Meeting

Easy Fundraising has now been set up to help with fundraising for the Amenity Trust. This is a registered charity number **Registered Charity Number 276979**

If you are purchasing anything online sign into the Easy Fundraising website and then go to the website for the company, you wish to purchase from. It means that the Amenity Trust get a donation, but it does not cost you anything. This means we get a monetary donation every time you shop which can be for groceries delivered from all the big retailers or a one-off purchase from others.

Currently we have 14 members using the Easy Fundraising Website and as clerk I personally have raised a donation total of £36.21, it is really easy to do. If anyone needs help please contact me.

We can also accept one off donation direct to the Amenity Trust to help us with the fundraising for new play equipment. Any donations will be gratefully received and can be paid into the following bank account.

Defibrillator Training – we are looking at the possibility of running a session at the end of September/October. There is still availability if you wish to come along. The session is around 90 minutes and will be held on an evening.

Hedges/Verges – on some roads in the parish, it has been noted that the condition of the hedges/verges is causing some visibility issues to drivers. Although hedges should not be trimmed during nesting season, there are exceptions when there are road safety issues.

Highways:

19th August to 8th September Gara Bridge to Lower Common, Gara Bridge. Alternative route will be signposted for vehicles. This restriction is to allow emergency repairs to Gara Bridge. NOTE received 19 August Unfortunately, we have had to install an Emergency Road Closure at Gara Bridge as it was damaged this morning. We anticipate the closure to be in place for approximately 6 weeks although we will endeavour to open it sooner. Our contractor is starting the repairs asap. We are disappointed to see the grade 2 listed structure damaged once again, although we have the vehicle details and will seek to reclaim the cost of repairs. To utilise the road closure, we are bringing forward Phase 1 of the protection scheme, which was originally programmed for 7th October. We will send out another letter to the residents informing them that we have brought our scheme forward to complete it early. We are confident that once Phase 1 is installed we will reduce the likelihood of the bridge being damaged significantly. For updates regarding the closure please refer to the website 'One.Network'.

2nd **to 9**th **September, Beneknowle to Brushford Bridge, Avonwick**. Road Closure and diversions in place between the hours of 08.00 hrs and 17.00 hours. Temporary closure of Avonwick-Diptford road to allow repair of former railway bridge.

9 September to 13 September Road closure at Kitterford Cross Road From Ladywell Farm to Kittaford Cross to be closed for alterations to defective dip at Kitterford Cross roundabout. **9 September to 13 September Traffic lights on road to Woodpecker** Temporary traffic lights on road from Avonwick to Woodpecker during diversion due to road closure at Kitterford cross.

7th to 25th October, Gara Bridge to Lower Common, Gara Bridge. Alternative route will be signposted for vehicles. This is to enable the repairing of the damaged bridge parapet and installing protection works. **Note** – this may have been superseded by the above.

21st to **25**th November, Road Closure from junction of Lincombe Cross to Bradridge Cross for South West Water to complete utility works.


Primrose Trail – It has been noted that unauthorised signs have been put in place on the proposed trail.

Graveyard – currently the mapping of the graves is ongoing. The Graveyard has had its first grass cut under the management of South Hams District Council. It is the first time in many years that all the Graveyard has been cut. There is still a substantial amount of grass to be raked off. Hopefully the church and volunteers will be able to rake the grass to enable families to easily visit their family graves. Work is being scheduled for a compost bin to be built for excess grass cuttings and spent flowers to be put in.
