NORTH HUISH COMMUNITY GROUP



This group was set up in 2023 with the purpose of organising community events for the residents of North Huish and surrounding villages. The venue is St Mary's Church, North Huish, now closed for regular public worship but kept open to the public, providing a meeting space for the local community. This beautiful Grade 1 listed building is in the care of the Churches Conservation Trust, a national charity protecting historic churches at risk. Funds donated at events held there, help to support the cost of repair and maintenance which, in a typical year, can amount to nearly £2,000. Currently, there is a power supply but no electric circuit installed so, this year, a proportion of the funds raised are to be set aside to pay for the installation of electric sockets where they are most needed for safety and convenience when running events.

<u>Defibrillator Training</u> – we are looking at the possibility of running a session at the end of October on a Thursday evening – date to be confirmed. There is still availability if you wish to come along. The session is around 90 minutes and will be held on an evening.

<u>Amenity Trust/Playing Field</u> – The Bamboo at the edge of the playing field has been chopped down and the roots have been treated. Currently the area is sectioned off whilst this is being completed.

TRIALS AND TRIBULATIONS ON THE TARMAC

The peril of potholes is a reality on our roads and, as the weather gets wetter, road damage worsens. Why are they dangerous and how can you stay safe?

Damage - If you hit a hole, you risk wrecking your tyres, suspension and steering system, not to mention the possibility of dinking your undercarriage. Regular small jolts enhance damage over time, too.

Control - Smack into a decent-sized hole - even smaller ones - and you will lose control, for a brief moment at least, or longer. This endangers yourself and other road users.

2 wheels, 2 feet - Cyclists are increasingly being injured from hitting potholes. And dodging them on two feet — on pavements, zebra crossings or when crossing the road — is becoming an evermore hazardous trial for pedestrians.

Advice - Avoid potholes where it is safe to do so. If you have to pass over them, reduce speed and increase your distance from other vehicles. Report potholes to local authorities and lobby for more work to be done!

GREEN LIGHT FOR DEVON AND TORBAY COMBINED COUNTY AUTHORITY

Devon and Torbay's proposal to create a Combined County Authority (CCA) has been given the green light by the new Government. It means that a whole raft of powers, responsibilities, and funding will be devolved to Devon and Torbay from Whitehall, enabling important decisions to be made locally on local priorities such as jobs and skills, housing, and the environment.

Establishing the CCA is legally required in order for Devon and Torbay to assume responsibility for the new funds and powers, but the decision by the previous Government was deferred in June pending the General Election in July.

Last month, the two Leaders of Devon County Council and Torbay Council initially wrote to the new Deputy Prime Minister and Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government, the Rt Hon Angela Rayner MP, asking the Government for a meeting to discuss the proposal. And now, the Government has confirmed that the Devon and Torbay proposal, first submitted to Government in May 2024, is officially back on track.

It's hoped that with draft regulations to create the CCA to be made this Autumn, the Devon and Torbay CCA could hold its first meeting early in the New Year.

PLAYING FIELD CLEAN-UP
