NORTH HUISH COMMUNITY GROUP



This group was set up in 2023 with the purpose of organising community events for the residents of North Huish and surrounding villages. The venue is St Mary's Church, North Huish, now closed for regular public worship but kept open to the public, providing a

meeting space for the local community. This beautiful Grade 1 listed building is in the care of the Churches Conservation Trust, a national charity protecting historic churches at risk. Funds donated at events held there, help to support the cost of repair and maintenance which, in a typical year, can amount to nearly £2,000. Currently, there is a power supply but no electric circuit installed so, this year, a proportion of the funds raised are to be set aside to pay for the installation of electric sockets where they are most needed for safety and convenience when running events.



THE DIPTFORD GRUMBLER

Here again, with this month's outburst!

This month's grumble is about hospitals. Not that I am against hospitals per se, it is the layout or design of them that annoys as does the sheer cost of visiting them.

The entrance is now a shopping mall. Coffee shops, supermarkets, Smiths, restaurants, and gift shops. There are hundreds of people, like Oxford Street used be on Christmas Eve. Whole families out for an excursion, what are they all doing?

As ever, I arrive too early for my appointment so have a coffee.

I was a little surprised that Greggs ran the coffee shop. It is full of cakes, Chelsea buns, doughnuts, chocolate gateaux, cream fingers, iced sponges, and meringues. If that does not grab you there are sausage rolls, pasties, and pies. Not entirely designed for healthy eating I thought, but seemed to be doing a roaring trade so obviously has NHS approval judging by the vast number of staff eating and drinking there.

I got my coffee, a small americano and a packet of crisps (I didn't know what to reply to: "an' what you havin' wiv' that?"). Only £ 7.20! I asked for a receipt just to check I had not bought a round of drinks for everyone. Yes £ 4.80 for a small americano and £ 2.40 for a packet of crisps. Not helped by the person sitting next to me stating "You should have had takeaway much cheaper."

"But I was not taking it away."

"Nah! No-one does, look around, all takeaway cups."

He was correct.

Whilst musing on how the family opposite managed to afford their lunch, which I roughly calculated to come to over £50. I was taken by the noise level. I seem to recall hospitals being much like libraries with do not disturb signs or the must be obeyed "silence please." This was like a pub at closing time. With another half an hour to kill, I bought a newspaper and a bar of chocolate. Interestingly the paper was the same price as everywhere else, but the chocolate was not 90p but £ 1.30, a 44% increase. Why? One may pay more for the ambience in certain circumstances, but in a distinctly malodourous hospital?

Anyway, having struggled through the shopping precinct I now have to find the department where my appointment is. The hospital seemed to be designed by an architect who qualified at the Hampton Court maze. I could only conclude that if I managed to reach the department then clearly, I was A1 fit and could be immediately discharged.

Corridor, lift, corridor, stairs, another corridor, ask for directions, corridor. Wrong zone, back down the corridor, up another lift. Finally, "take a seat the consultant will be with shortly." No, he won't. "Afraid we are running late. "

I am not surprised you are running late; the staff must undergo a half marathon every time they have to reach the consulting rooms.

No wonder the NHS staff complain of exhaustion, they have spent most of their working hours walking up and down corridors. I guess they deserve a Gregg's cake or two at the end of the shift.

The appointment is now over, and I have spent four hours at the hospital, for a twenty-minute consultation. I nervously approached the car parking machine, keyed in my registration and a telephone number appeared. Oh, no it's not a telephone number, it is the cost of parking!

FIREWORKS



I have been asked to remind everyone in the village please to remember that we live in a rural area, with a lot of vulnerable animals around. Not only dogs and cats, but horses, sheep and cattle etc can all be frightened by fireworks.

There are laws in place limiting the use of fireworks but apart from those, please consider your neighbours and their animals all of whom may be more vulnerable than you may think.

Fireworks can be seriously disturbing to those with PTSD and Autism too.

Think before you buy - is it better to go to an organised display than have a limited number in your own garden? If you do, why not look for the less noisy ones which are available?

FIREWORKS CAN BE FUN FOR YOU, BUT NOT FOR ANIMALS

Every year, thousands of animals will suffer as a result of fireworks being let off. Animals have very acute hearing. Loud bangs and whistles may cause them actual pain in their ears.

Fireworks must not be set off near livestock or horses in fields, or close to buildings housing livestock.

Anyone planning a firework display in a rural area should warn neighbouring farmers in advance.

The Laws concerning fireworks

- It is illegal for anyone under 18 to possess a firework in a public place
- Fireworks cannot be set off by a private individual between 11pm and 7am except for certain nights of the year
- It is an offence to cause any unnecessary suffering to any captive or domestic animal Added to this are the dangers of 'Chinese Lanterns' being released the wind can take them considerable distances and, pretty though they undoubtedly are, there have been instances locally of their remains, still alight, landing on or near agricultural barns with the risk of fire. Animals can sometimes eat fallen parts, leading to internal bleeding and a painful death.
